Subcontracting Plan Guidance and Subcontract Opportunities

Statutory & Plan Requirements

Subcontracting plans are clearly defined and the statutory requirements can be found in FAR 19.702 and the subcontracting plan requirements can be located in FAR 19.704 (a) (9). Large business concerns receiving contract awards valued in excess of \$650,000.00 or (\$1.5 Million for construction) are required to adopt a subcontracting plan that adopts with the 52.219-9 clause.

Subcontracting Plan Contents

A subcontracting plan contains separate percentage goals for small businesses within each of the social economic categories and for each option year the plan is expected to be awarded. Your statement must be clear addressing the amount of funds that are planned to be allocated to each of the social economic categories, (including ANC and Indian tribes) a clear description of the subcontracted commodities and how small businesses are involved, also how goals are achieved and targeted sources identified. A statement of indirect funds must be included should they be allocated among social economic categories, a description of the subcontracting administrator's and a description of the efforts used to ensure and equal opportunity for all social economic categories.

Since the end of the fiscal year (FY) 2008 all Subcontracting Plans must be reported twice each year to the Electronic Subcontracting Reporting System (eSRS). The reports replace the Standard Form (SF) 294s and 295s.
