BAY, GAUTIER, JACKSON COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI**

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This District has received an application for a Department of the Army permit pursuant to Section 10 of the River and Harbor Act of 1899 (33 USC 403), and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC 1344). Please communicate this information to interested parties.

WATERWAY: Graveline Bayou north of Graveline Bay, east of Highway 57 and south of Highway 90 in Section 30, Township 7 South, Range 7 West, Gautier, Jackson County, Mississippi.

WORK: The applicant proposes to discharge 17.05 acres of fill material into jurisdictional wetlands for the purpose of constructing retail outlets, a hotel, and apartment complex. The project will consist of five retail outlets, a hotel, 25 apartment buildings, more than 1200

parking spaces, and a 2-acre storm water detention basin. The development will be constructed on a 37.95 acre parcel. A storm water drainage system will be installed throughout the project area to direct water to the 2-acre detention basin located in the south central portion of the development.

The project site is located on the northeast corner where Mississippi Highway 57 and U.S. Highway 90 intersect in Gautier, MS. Graveline Bay is located about 2.2 miles to the south. Wetlands occupy most of the eastern half of the property and about half of the northern portion. The total amount of wetlands on the property is 19.35 acres. There are 2.30 acres of the wetlands that will be avoided. This tract is mostly forested with a sapling/shrub stratum consisting of dense stands of slash pine. The upland portion of the tract consists of large pecan trees and some residential buildings. The applicant proposes to mitigate for 17.05 acres of medium-quality pine savanna wetlands by purchasing the appropriate number of mitigation credits from a Corps-approved mitigation bank.

The applicant has applied for certification from the State of Mississippi in accordance with Section 401(a)(1) of the Clean Water Act, and upon completion of the required advertising, a determination relative to certification will be made. The applicant has certified that the proposed activity complies with and will be conducted in a manner that is consistent with the Mississippi Coastal Zone Management Program. A determination relative to consistency will be made by the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources.

This public notice is being distributed to all known interested persons in order to assist in developing facts on which a decision by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) can be based. For accuracy and completeness of the record, all data in support of or in opposition to the proposed work should be submitted in writing setting forth sufficient detail to furnish a clear understanding of the reasons for support or opposition. The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impact, including cumulative impacts, of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefit which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered, including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, cultural values, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, flood plain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food production, and in general, the needs and welfare of the people.

The Corps is soliciting comments from the public; Federal, State, and local agencies and officials; Indian Tribes; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this proposed activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for this proposal. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the

preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the proposed activity.

Any person may request, in writing, within the comment period specified in this notice, that a public hearing be held to consider this application. Requests for public hearings shall state with particularity, the reasons for holding a public hearing. Evaluation of the probable impacts involving deposits of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States will include the application of guidelines established by the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

The National Register of Historic Places has been consulted and no properties listed in or eligible for the National Register are known to exist which would be affected by the proposed work. This review constitutes the full extent of cultural resources investigations unless comment to this notice is received documenting that significant sites or properties exist which may be affected by this work, or that adequately documents that a potential exists for the location of significant sites or properties within the permit area. Copies of this notice are being sent to the State Historic Preservation Officer and the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service, Division of Archeological Services.

Preliminary review of this application and the U.S. Department of the Interior List of Endangered and Threatened Wildlife and Plants indicates that the proposed activity will not affect listed endangered or threatened species, or their critical habitat.




FIGURE 2. SANTA ROSA DEVELOPMENT COMPANY HIGHWAY 57 MIXED-USE PROJECT
