GENERAL

Ms. Hutton and Mr. Woods both stated that no calls had been received from local residents during October 2016. Ms. Hutton stated she thought that resident health claims had been resolved by Fort Campbell. Ms. Lloyd asked that Ms. Jones discuss further on the next monthly call.

MAIN INSTALLATION

Remedial Action - No current remedial action

Supplemental Remedial Investigation (SRI)/Focused Feasibility Study (FFS)

Mr. Holmes stated that 5 fluvial monitoring wells were installed during first 10-day shift of work and that second 10-day shift of work began 07 November. Plan is to install the remaining monitoring wells, complete development, and collect groundwater samples during the current shift.

Mr. Holmes stated that the access agreement for the intermediate well on the Belz Foundation property remains to be executed. Mr. Woods stated that TDEC would contact property owner to facilitate if possible.

DUNN FIELD

Remedial Action - FSVE system shut down in 2012. AS/SVE system operating.

Quarterly effluent sample was not collected during the October LTM event due to system shutdown from condensate drain alarm. Repairs made by Kaeser on 20 October and quarterly sample will be collected week of 07 November.

Blower #1 was removed by Kaeser on 07 November and transported to their facility. The blower will be inspected for additional damage and an estimate for repairs will be provided.

Mr. Holmes stated he was preparing to draft the AS/SVE Operations Report for the first semi-annual reporting period.

Mr. Calhoun stated that responses to EPA comments received on 21 October for the AS Well Installation Work Plan had been completed and submitted for Army review.

Mr. Calhoun stated that additional attempts to contact MLGW had gone unanswered and reached out to Mr. Woods for assistance. Mr. Woods stated contact had been made with Mr. Randy Womack in the MLGW Legal department. If there is no response by the end of the week, TDEC will send a letter to MLGW with a short turnaround time for response. Per TDEC leadership, if there is no response, TDEC will issue an order to compel response. Tentative mobilization date for the AS well install is scheduled for 5 December.

Mr. Calhoun stated that responses to EPA comments received on 25 October for the MIP Survey Work Plan had been completed and submitted for Army review. Ms. Hutton's comments are pending.

Ms. Hutton inquired as to whether TDEC would be performing investigations of off-site properties as potential source areas for the northeast Dunn Field groundwater contaminant plume. Mr. Woods stated that if the results of the MIP Survey pointed in a particular direction, TDEC may investigate. However, TDEC does not want to second guess their previous investigations. Mr. Woods stated that there is currently vacillation within TDEC on shallow groundwater contamination in Memphis, especially at voluntary cleanup sites. TDEC is overlooking contamination (even solvent contamination) where there are no vapor intrusion issues. Due to the lack of funding no State dollars would be spent on the investigation and they would prefer to use EPA Site Assessment funds. Ms. Lloyd indicated that she would support TDEC in this appropriation request.

LONG TERM MONITORING

Mr. Holmes reminded the team that regulatory comments on the April 2016 summary report were due by 7 November and that any comments received will be addressed in the Annual report.

Mr. Holmes stated that the biennial sampling event for Main Installation and semiannual sampling event for Dunn Field/Off Depot was completed. Preliminary data has been received and is currently undergoing validation which will lead to preparation of the Annual Report.

OTHER ISSUES

Mr. Holmes stated that preparation of the 2017 Site Management Plan should be ready for Army review by the end of the week and submitted to regulators on 1 December with comments due on 30 December.
