DDMT warehouses and distributes an extensive inventory of DDMT consists of 642 acres of federally-owned land in the south central section of Memphis, Shelby County, Tennessee. It was placed on the National Priorities List effective November 13, 1992 (57 Federal Register 47180, October 14, 1992).
