LOCAL GROUPS INTEND TO APPLY FOR EPA GRANT

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has received a letter of intent to apply for a technical assistance grant (TAG) from the Defense Depot Memphis, Tennessee-Concerned Citizens' Committee (DDMT-CCC) in connection with Superfund and Base Realignment and Closure environmental cleanup and property reuse activities at the Defense Distribution Depot, Memphis, Tennessee.

The Superfund law allows for issuance of only one grant of up to \$50,000 per site to a single citizen's group for sites on the National Priorities List (NPL) of hazardous waste sites eligible for attention under the Federal Superfund clean-up program. The grant is provided to enable communities near an NPL site to hire a technical advisor to interpret EPA reports and assists in providing input to EPA on cleanup actions. In order to insure that all community views are represented in the recipient group, EPA encourages all groups interested in applying for this grant to consolidate and file a joint application. By April 23, 1999, groups or individuals wishing to join DDMT-CCC in applying for this grant must notify:
