UPDATE: Soil Removal at the Depot's Family Housing Area

As part of the Depot's environmental cleanup program, we are continuing to remove surface soil from the Family Housing area. Since July, we have removed and replaced the soil at the front and sides of the housing units and are now moving to the area along the fence line. We expect to have this final area completed within the next two (2) months

Once we have completed this project, the entire area around the housing units and along the fence line will have 6 - 12 inches of new, clean soil. The old soil, which contained unacceptable levels of Dieldrin, a pesticide that is no longer in use, has been removed and trucked to an approved, off-site landfill for disposal

During this final soil removal and due in large part to the work along the fence, we have asked our contractor, OHM Remediation Services, to put up a clear, protective, plastic sheet to help keep dust or materials on our side of the fence. If you notice any dust on your side of the fence during this project, I would ask that you contact me at the Depot

After the soil removal at the Family Housing area is complete it is our understanding that the Depot Redevelopment Corporation (DRC) will be partnering with a local agency that will provide housing for homeless families. These efforts are part of the Depot's commitment to restore, reuse and revitalize this facility.

Our next **Restoration Advisory Board (RAB)** meeting is October 15th at 6 p.m. in Building 144 at the Depot. Park at Gate 1 and enter through the side doors.
