The Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) meeting was held at 6:00 p.m. on June 17, 1999 at the Memphis Depot in the "J" Street Cafe, Building 274, 2163 Airways Boulevard, Memphis, Tennessee. The attendance list is attached

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION

- 1 MR. WILLIAMS. Good afternoon
- 2 MR. PHILLIPS Would the RAB members please take your seats?
- 3 MR. WILLIAMS: Good afternoon, everyone. My name is Mondell Williams. I'm the co-
- 4 chair for the RAB. Excuse me Can I get your undivided attention? We're
- 5 ready to start the RAB meeting. As I said once again, I'm the community
- 6 co-chair for the RAB. I'd just like to welcome everyone to the meeting
- 7 tonight. Tonight we'll have a one hour comment period right after the
- 8 RAB meeting. So if any of the community or anyone who would like to
- 9 ask any questions concerning the environmental problems that we have for
- 10 the cleanup for Dunn Field, we'll be glad to assist you with that.
- 11
- 12 And I'd like to make sure that everyone is signed in over there at the front
- 13 desk And make sure that you give a complete address so that if you need
- 14 any mailing information to come back to you, we'll be glad to send it to
- 15 you Make sure that you put your zip code on it And has everyone really
- 16 took a close look at the agenda tonight? I was just wondering if any of the
- 17 RAB members would like to add, change or alter the agenda? If not ---
- 18 MR. ENGLISH I move to accept the agenda.
- 19 MR. WILLIAMS. All in favor? Any opposed? Abstained? Okay. All right. The agenda
- 20 passes. If anyone would like to get up and give a comment or anything, I

1 would like for you to make sure that you state your first name clearly so
2 that the transcriber will be able to understand what you're saying. And I
3 want to let Shawn go over the April minutes

4 MR. PHILLIPS: Before we get into the meeting minutes from the previous month's meeting
5 - I was negligent to do this last month so I need to do it now. Our
6 community relations contractor, Frontline Corporate Communications, --
7 to assist our community relations specialist, Ms. Alma Moore, they have
8 hired an assistant for her. I should have introduced her last month. She's
9 talked to -- called many of the RAB members to help coordinate the RAB
10 meeting. Her name is Ms. Andrea Johnson and she told me to call her
11 Cookie. I don't know if she'll extend that honor. Would you please stand
12 up? I'm sure you'll see Ms. Johnson as we do door-to-door flyer handouts
13 and field work. Ms. Johnson will most likely be one of the folks you see
14 doing that activity. So I would like to welcome you to the team. Thank
15 you

16
17 Okay. During last month's minute or meeting rather, we did not approve
18 the April RAB minutes because Ms. Bradshaw noted that she thought
19 some of comments were missing from John Crellin's statement during the
20 Public Comment Period from April. We checked our original transcribed
21 minutes and we did not find any of the comments that were missing. We
22 use a professional reporting service, Alpha Reporting, for our minutes.
23 And those minutes serve as our legal record for our Administrative Record
24 of transcripts of this proceeding. Alpha Reporting uses a tape as a backup
25 to the court reporter's -- whatever you refer to as shorthand that they take.
26 We called and that back-up tape had already been destroyed by the time we
27 called. I made that point for them to please submit those tapes for us to
28 keep from now on, because we did not realize that occurred. If there were
29 points of clarification that need to be made, and referred back to that April

1 meeting, Ms. Bradshaw tonight you can make those points of clarification
2 so they will be recorded Do you have anything you want to state?
3 MS. BRADSHAW: I just want to make a point that the tapes were destroyed before you were
4 able to look back over them So you did do that so that I know But it is
5 a clarification that needs to be done on that.
6 MR. PHILLIPS: I would like the motion to ---
7 MS. PETERS: Mr. Chairman, I move that we accept the report of whatever meeting?
8 MR. PHILLIPS: The April meeting. Do we have a second? Those in favor? Those
9 opposed? Abstaining? Okay The April meeting minutes have been duly
10 reported Mondell for the May minutes.
11 MR. WILLIAMS: All right The May minutes were mailed out and hopefully everyone had a
12 chance to look over them to see if everything looks in line. And if so,
13 could I get a motion to approve the May minutes?
14 MS. PETERS: Mr. Chairman, I move that we accept the May minutes.
15 MR. WILLIAMS: Could I get a second? All in favor? Any opposed? Abstained? Minutes
16 carried. I've got one quick thing I would like to ask Mr. Jim Covington to
17 do during the RAB comment period, if you don't mind. This is sort of out
18 of line - I wish that he could possibly give us a quick overview of the re-
19 use of this Depot, bring us up to date on this.
20 MR. C. GRAY. Point of order We have an agenda
21 MR. WILLIAMS. I understand, but after doing the RAB commentary, it's just a comment he's
22 going to make, during the RAB comment period.
23 MR. C. GRAY: Okay.
24 MR. WILLIAMS: So we'll move right along with the agenda and I'll turn it back over to
25 Shawn.
26 MR. PHILLIPS: Let me address that question, the point of order that was brought up.
27 After last month's meeting, I believe it was Mr. Tyler that brought up the
28 request for -- to know about the re-use plan. We've talked to Mr.

1 Covington from the Depot Redevelopment Corporation (DRC). You
2 volunteered for the August time frame for a brief update?

3 MR. COVINGTON: I can do it tonight or I can do it ---

4 MR. PHILLIPS: August. We're interested in a real good look at the re-use plan, thank you.
5 Let me mention another item which was mailed to me at my residence this
6 past month. I'm holding up a copy of the MLGW Annual Groundwater
7 Report, the water quality report from 1998. I don't know if other people
8 who drink MLGW water got this or not, but we brought several copies of
9 this in. Mr. Webb was nice enough to provide us with, I think, 50 copies
10 And I was real impressed with the quality of the report. I'd like to make
11 you aware that exists

12
13 Okay. Now, during the month we always welcome requests from RAB
14 members for topics to be put onto the agenda. Normally, we propose to
15 do topics which are pertinent field work or sample results studies that are
16 coming in, but we always welcome the opportunity to have RAB input on
17 the development on the agenda. That doesn't just mean tonight here when
18 we approve and accept it, the agenda for that night. So I'd like to offer
19 that up to the RAB members to give Ms. Moore a call whenever you have
20 issues you would like to bring and put on the agenda

21
22 Last month Kevin Clay asked me a question about when would the sample
23 results and when would the decision for the golf course be open for public
24 comment. I told him that will be available during the proposed plan for the
25 Main Installation. I told him I'd give him a schedule for that. So we
26 looked at our schedule, and in December of 1999 the Final Remedial
27 Investigation Report for the Main Installation - which does not include
28 Dunn Field - but the Main Installation, December of 1999 that report is due
29 out if we can maintain our schedule. In March of 2000, the Feasibility

1 Study, which evaluates alternatives to remediate sites or whatever that
2 comes out of that Remedial Investigation, that document comes out in
3 March of 2000. A month later in April, the Defense Logistics Agency
4 (DLA) would have produced its proposed plan and how they're going to
5 implement -- that proposed plan is what goes out for public comment
6 We're anticipating that public comment will begin in April of next year.
7

8 Also, another order from last month - I've already spoken with Mr Bond
9 about this - but he had asked a question regarding what had changed with
10 the golf course since he had attended a meeting back in October of 1998, a
11 BCT meeting. What we've done to address that - there are two items. For
12 tonight's meeting we went back from October, December, January of 1999,
13 and May of 1999 and photocopied the excerpts from the BCT meeting
14 minutes where the golf course was discussed. We have that for you
15 tonight. In addition to this, Mr. Bond's question made me realize that since
16 last year we hadn't done an update or we hadn't informed the RAB of the
17 status of all assessments we've been performing on the golf course I
18 believe the best solution to that and a solution that I've started is to have a
19 fact sheet It's a draft right now. Just finished it last week as a matter of
20 fact, which speaks to the Risk Assessment, the sampling work, the
21 sampling of the ponds where we tried to collect fish samples I've
22 forwarded that document to some of our other team members who are
23 involved to make sure I haven't said anything that's incorrect. And I hope
24 that I would have that fact sheet mailed out with the meeting minutes of
25 this meeting prior to July's RAB meeting.
26

27 We had a verbal public comment session last month that was after the RAB
28 meeting for a proposed action at the old paint shop and maintenance areas.
29 During that Public Comment Period it was asked by Ms. Bradshaw for an

1 extension of 30 days. So we have extended that to July 15 and we'll put
2 that announcement in the Tri-State Defender, Silver Star News and the
3 Commercial Appeal. So the Public Comment Period for the paint shop has
4 been extended to July 15. And we also have -- let me make sure I have a
5 copy of this with me

6
7 Something else we'll mail out with the meeting minutes from tonight's
8 meeting is an Executive Summary of that. A request was made for that.
9 We'll also mail out an Executive Summary for the Chemical Warfare
10 Materiel removal which we're going to be seeing presentations on tonight
11

12 Ms Bradshaw stated at last month's RAB meeting that RAB members
13 should get of copy of those documents to review. Here are the two
14 documents. This is the Chemical Warfare Material document that we're
15 going to be talking about tonight, and this is -- I'm sorry. Engineering
16 Evaluation and Cost Analysis, that's what EE/CA stands for. Here is the
17 Engineering Evaluation and Cost Analysis for the meeting we had last
18 month. We have copies of these documents in our repository. We also
19 have additional, I believe an additional copy, in our reading room here at
20 the Depot. We think it's most efficient to submit and mail out to the RAB
21 members - the Executive Summary. But if you would still like to review
22 the document in detail, come talk to us at our reading room. With our
23 additional copies we can check out a copy to you for a week or whatever,
24 but these copies are limited.

25
26 Another item of business -- I believe our only item of New Business
27 tonight, the BCT (Base Realignment and Closure Cleanup Team) update.
28 In lieu of time with our presentations, we need RAB and the Public
29 Comment Period before we adjourn the meeting, we're going to delay our

1 BCT update until July. I'd like to point out that Terri Gray attended today,
2 and would ask her if she could keep some issues fresh in her mind so she
3 can bring them back to the table next month. Thank you We need a
4 volunteer for our July 15 BCT Cleanup Team meeting Mr Tyler? Thank
5 you, Mr. Tyler

6 MR. WILLIAMS: Okay. It's time for the RAB comment period Anyone who would like to
7 bring any issues up, other than the one for -- Ms. Bradshaw?

8 MS. BRADSHAW: I'm just puzzled that is the only document for EE/CA what you was talking
9 about we were supposed to comment on last week Shawn, I fail to see
10 why the people that is on this board that wanted to see them shouldn't have
11 the opportunity to go through those files. I'm asking that you copy those
12 and send them out to those who want them, because it shouldn't -- I've
13 copied many files at the Depot and I don't understand why you are so
14 hesitant about getting these documents out to people The summary
15 should already be given to us before comment time. I see something
16 wrong with that. Is it something that you're hiding? It makes me feel like
17 that you're hiding something.

18 MR. PHILLIPS: We're not hiding anything, Ms. Bradshaw. What we have is we have
19 exceeded the legal requirements. You're only required to have two
20 Information Repositories and we have four Usually, when I get these
21 documents produced by my contractor, we submit them to regulators We
22 put them in our repositories We get two copies for our office. I'm even
23 making one of those additional copies available in our reading room Is
24 there something you would like add to this?

25 MR. BALLARD: This is Turpin Ballard, EPA I was just going to say that the requirement is
26 for the Administrative Record for the actions to be made available to the
27 public in Information Repositories and that's what the Depot has done.
28 There is no requirement for you people to get individual copies of the

1 material, however, they are welcome to make any copies that they care to
 2 from materials that are in the repositories.

3 MR. PHILLIPS Mr. Brayon, you had a comment?

4 MR. BRAYON: This is a point of inquiry about the mailings. I've had one neighbor or two
 5 who say they did not get a mailing. This may come from Ms. Black. What
 6 is the extent of our mailing list like people on Rozelle where I live? I was
 7 under the impression that everybody on Rozelle was receiving a mailout of
 8 the newsletter that comes out intermittently.

9 MR. PHILLIPS: I would like ask Ms. Moore to address that.

10 MS. MOORE: I've contracted a mailing service. They should get our newsletter. If you
 11 will give them the number that's listed on the back of your newsletter that
 12 states to call me should they want to be on the mailing list. I'll be glad to
 13 add them and to check the master list to see why they haven't received a
 14 newsletter. The only way for me to follow up on that is to get response
 15 from people in the community to say they haven't gotten a newsletter.
 16 Maybe they were just intermittently left off. I need to inquire about that,
 17 but they can call and I can add them to the mailing list.

18 MR. PHILLIPS: Can you ask Mr. Brayon who those individuals are tonight? Do you have
 19 the street addresses?

20 MR. BRAYON: As a matter of fact, I'll give you list of all of the people on Rozelle Street
 21 and let you check on that, okay? Because I was under the impression with
 22 information that I had before now that we were on that list.

23 MR. PHILLIPS: I was too, sir. Ms. Peters?

24 MS. PETERS: I'd like to make a comment that there was a good paper write-up in the
 25 paper today, in the morning paper, about the four o'clock meeting, and the
 26 meeting and everything that was going to happen here tonight. So if any of
 27 those people read the paper, they would know we're having a meeting
 28 tonight. They can receive the information because there was a good write-
 29 up.

- 1 MR. PHILLIPS: Thank you, ma'am Mr. Kevin Clay?
- 2 MR. CLAY: I'd like to follow up on what Mr. Brayon said. I wanted to address this last
3 month but it might sound kind of self-serving. I too received a lot of
4 questions about these mailings that we send out periodically. And I know
5 mine didn't come to my house. So I've got some concerns about the list of
6 people who are actually getting the mail-out. I've turned in several lists of
7 people. Quite frankly, most of them don't even know that the letters are
8 being mailed. So I can assure you that it seems like something is very
9 wrong with our delivery system. And, you know, it would be a good idea
10 to kind of correct that, you know, because that is coming late to the
11 community for those on it. That's being extremely short-sighted if you're
12 trying to kind of limit, you know, how mailings are limited, you know,
13 where it's going.
- 14 MS. MOORE: I use a contractor for the mailing list, and there's no way for me to know
15 whether a person doesn't receive it unless a RAB member or another
16 community member let's me know. There are over 5,000 newsletters
17 mailed. If someone wants an alternative for monitoring the mailing system,
18 in order for me to check the contractor that I use, I need to know these
19 things. But you can call 544-0613 any time and turn names in. If it hasn't
20 been done, let me know again and I would check on it again.
- 21 MR. PHILLIPS: Let me point out that this is the way the system is supposed to work. If
22 you have neighbors that aren't getting something, Mr. Brayon and Mr.
23 Clay, you said you didn't receive it at your personal residence?
- 24 MR. CLAY: Right
- 25 MR. PHILLIPS: You received in the past there?
- 26 MR. CLAY: Well, actually, the one I got was for my old address. That's the address we
27 were talking about. I think it's asking way too much of the RAB members
28 to go back in the neighborhood and find out who's not getting their mail. I
29 think that's something that people are getting paid for should follow up on.

- 1 And if we turn -- we've got 5,000 people on the mailing list, you ought to
 2 have 5,000 people getting the mail. That's my comment
- 3 MR. PHILLIPS: Thank you. We will check into this, Mr. Clay Mr. Tyler? This will be the
 4 last RAB comment We need to open it up for public comments.
- 5 MR. TYLER: My concern is --Ms. Bradshaw. It wouldn't be out of line to ask the Depot
 6 to make her a copy of that EE/CA and mail it to her at Depot's expense
 7 since she spends a lot of her time and energy to come in here and donates a
 8 lot of her time to make her a copy of the EE/CA and mail it to her? Is this
 9 illegal, wrong or immoral?
- 10 MR. BALLARD: It would be considered preferential treatment, and once you open the door
 11 and say okay, we're going to do one for Ms. Bradshaw, well, you'd almost
 12 have to make it available for everybody and there's just no budget for that
- 13 MR. TYLER: This is a request by someone other than Ms. Bradshaw for her
- 14 MR. BALLARD: I understand. I understand It's the same thing though
- 15 MR. TYLER: My second question When are we going to get this information on the
 16 Internet so it can be downloaded on someone else's printer at no cost to the
 17 government since we're concerned about cost?
- 18 MR. BALLARD: That I don't know.
- 19 MR. PHILLIPS: I don't have an answer on that either, Mr. Tyler Ms. Bradshaw, and then
 20 we're going to go to public comment
- 21 MS. BRADSHAW: I would like to say that I did report this matter to the officials at the
 22 environmental justice conference. We felt like that the information still is
 23 not being given to the people in the community. When you ask someone to
 24 give a comment on even a summary, we should have received that. And I
 25 see nothing wrong -- this board is getting money. It gets money to do
 26 things with, and I don't even see anything that we have actually done, you
 27 know, just for this board.
 28

1 Now, if you're worried about copying and most of the time when I come
 2 up here and get copies, I will bring my own paper and copy it myself. But
 3 that's time consuming and I feel like that people could read these
 4 documents a lot better from their home and go through it before the
 5 meeting. And you all promised us that we would get materials before the
 6 meeting, before we come here. And so you need to do better

7
 8 And talking about me getting special treatment, I'm not asking for that, but
 9 we are -- I represent the environmental justice group in this community.
 10 So it ought to be fair. You gave it to Peace and Justice and they had their
 11 own repository at one time. So I feel like is this discriminatory to what
 12 you're doing, that you did something for one group and you didn't do it for
 13 another?

14 MR. PHILLIPS Thank you for your comment.

15 MR. WILLIAMS. We would like to open up the floor for public comments if anyone would
 16 like to have any further comments. Be sure to state your name so the
 17 transcriber will be able to record it. Mr. Bradshaw?

18 MR. BRADSHAW. My name is Kenneth Bradshaw. I've got a couple of concerns here. One
 19 of them is about the drinking water. This Water Quality Report of 1998
 20 states on the back page of this Annual Comprehensive Water Analyses. It
 21 gives a list of chemicals, PCBs and VOCs. And it says, "The components
 22 listed below have been analyzed for source water and/or treated water." A
 23 lot of these chemicals on this list are the same chemicals that the Depot had
 24 or deposited in the fluvial aquifer. One of my questions is does Memphis
 25 Light, Gas & Water (MLGW), are they saying that some of the Depot
 26 chemicals are now in the Memphis Sands aquifer?

27
 28 Another question of mine related to the water. In 1990, Law
 29 Environmental Studies said some of these same contaminants were in the

1 fluvial aquifer. And the remediation of the water, the groundwater in 1999,
2 I want to refer to Report R that indicate what level of these chemicals or
3 contaminants were in the Memphis Sands aquifer during the period
4 between the Law Environmental.

5
6 Another problem of mine -- concern of mine is I heard a lot about the
7 cleanup of the Depot property complies fully with the requirements of
8 Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation Liability Act,
9 otherwise known as CERCLA. I talked to the Department of Justice
10 concerning this. It seems to me there's nothing in the Comprehensive
11 Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act that places DoD
12 sites under CERCLA. If that's the case, this whole cleanup you're doing is
13 illegal, and you're going to have any kind of legal thing from Congress up
14 to the president of the United States to justify what you're doing. That
15 seems like a Title VI violation of our civil rights, especially if that
16 groundwater is contaminated and for nine years nobody at MLGW,
17 Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation -- if this
18 groundwater in the Memphis Sands aquifer has been contaminated for nine
19 years, why haven't we been told this? Does anyone want to answer those
20 questions?

21 MR PHILLIPS Thank you. I may defer to you if you would like to answer something, but
22 I'm looking at the list on Page 10 of this handout And it's quite a long list
23 of chemicals. It looks like this for RAB members. And I see several of
24 things we have detected in our shallow aquifer which we felt that we
25 should remediate and remove from the ground But the caption above it
26 says, "The components listed below have been analyzed for source water
27 and/or treated water. They are below detection limits in the drinking water
28 and have therefore not been listed in the earlier tables with their maximum

1 containment levels." That's the only thing I can comment on. MLGW
2 would have to comment on anything else it says.

3 MR. BRADSHAW: Then I'd address the question to MLGW The comment you made, I don't
4 understand how it relates to what I was saying because they are below
5 detection limits in the drinking water. Because they are below detection
6 limits, that doesn't mean they don't exist in the drinking water. I think you
7 should point out, and MLGW is the one that was in charge of the testing to
8 see there's no oversight.

9 MS. PETERS. Johnnie Mae Peters. The reason I'm asking this question, Light, Gas and
10 Water came to one of our RAB meetings, and they know they have two
11 wells on this site that's contaminated. But they said they have to have 89
12 wells ran a day And when they mix these two wells with them 89 wells, it
13 didn't make no difference because you are just going to get 1,000th of
14 something or whatever this was. They said right here at this place and they
15 said --- (inaudible interruption.)

16 MR. PHILLIPS: We're getting a call to order from the chair. You had a second part to your
17 original question?

18 MR. BRADSHAW: I didn't get an answer to my first one.

19 MR. PHILLIPS: Okay. Below detection -- they didn't detect It's below detection limits.
20 They did not detect it Did you want to respond to the second part of his
21 question?

22 MR. BRADSHAW: They (inaudible) a difference between the drinking water -- excuse me.
23 They said drinking water is below detection limits, and the other
24 components listed below have been analyzed for source water and/or
25 treated water. That's two different sentences and two different means.

26 MR. PHILLIPS: Would you like to try to handle that, Mr. Gentry?

27 MR. GENTRY: Randy Gentry.

28 MR. WILLIAMS He is with the Groundwater Institute from the University of Memphis.

- 1 MR. GENTRY: The only thing that I can really address, there is routinely what I know of
 2 MLGW's policies and practices are, that they routinely sample the
 3 production wells in the Allen Well Field and sample the treated water. I'm
 4 sure they would be happy to give you a copy of their historical data, any
 5 records that they have regarding any samples that they have collected in the
 6 past. All you have to do is call that hotline number and they can get it for
 7 you. Now, I'm not exactly sure what your question is as far as source
 8 water and drinking water, what you're asking there, and the difference
 9 between constituents. When they record a below-detection limit, what
 10 they're normally saying is just by the nature of testing procedure that they
 11 use, they were not able to detect the material in their sampling.
- 12 MR. BRADSHAW: If you say you're not sure, I'll leave it at that, you're not sure. You
 13 didn't get to the part of the question -- since 1990, Law Environmental
 14 Studies indicated these contaminants in the fluvial aquifer. What has
 15 occurred, what studies or whatever -- why hasn't MLGW told us that these
 16 contaminants was in the Memphis Sands aquifer within that nine-year
 17 period?
- 18 MR. WILLIAMS: Hold on a second, Mr. Bradshaw. As to the RAB bylaws, we have five
 19 minutes per person for comment period.
- 20 MR. BRADSHAW: I haven't been commenting. I asked the question in one and a half minutes.
 21 It took five minutes to understand -- I haven't used five minutes.
- 22 MR. PHILLIPS: Hopefully, the transcriber ---
- 23 MR. BRADSHAW: Can we get a clarification on that? I haven't used five minutes.
- 24 MR. WILLIAMS: The timekeeper says you used five minutes.
- 25 MR. BRADSHAW: How many minutes have I used when I asked my two questions?
- 26 MS. MOORE: After the question - five minutes. You can write them down and we'll get
 27 MLGW --
- 28 MR. BRADSHAW: I get five minutes to ask the question, or do I get five minutes to ask
 29 the question and comment? They never got to the CERCLA part.

- 1 MR. BALLARD: I can give that to you in 30 seconds
- 2 MR. PHILLIPS: Okay We'll respond to the CERCLA part and then we need to see if there
- 3 are any other citizens who would like to comment during this period
- 4 MR. BALLARD: You said you couldn't find in the CERCLA which would make DoD
- 5 subject to CERCLA, correct?
- 6 MS BRADSHAW No. I said there's no law been passed to put DoD on the jurisdictional part.
- 7 MR. BALLARD Section 120 of CERCLA provides for federal facilities to be subject to
- 8 CERCLA, the same as anybody else. And the fact that this site is on the
- 9 national ---
- 10 MR. BRADSHAW: U.S. Code what?
- 11 MR. BALLARD: Section 9620, USC 9620.
- 12 MR. BRADSHAW: What else? I'm not naive. I know a little about the U S. Code. I'm
- 13 very familiar with 42 U.S. Code 96 ---
- 14 MR. BALLARD: Well, this is 42 USC 9620
- 15 MR. PHILLIPS: I believe we've made a reasonable effort to respond to this. Are there any
- 16 other citizens who have questions during this period? Okay
- 17 MR. WILLIAMS: Is there anyone else who would like to comment before we adjourn the
- 18 meeting? Ms. Hooks?
- 19 MS. HOOKS Thank you. Inasmuch that several of the issues, not only from the
- 20 community but from the comments from the citizens here as well as
- 21 members of the RAB stem from the drinking water, I'd like to request that
- 22 we ask Light, Gas & Water to provide a representative here for the
- 23 purpose of answering the very questions that Mr. Bradshaw asked and any
- 24 other questions I know they've appeared before us before, but it might be
- 25 a good idea to see whether or not they have someone at the table. When
- 26 these issues arise, they are the ones that are the protectors of the water that
- 27 we drink and pay for, that they can come to the table for the purposes of
- 28 being available to not only the board but to the citizens we have here if they
- 29 have questions that arise relative to the drinking water

1 MR. PHILLIPS: I can say in general James Webb is here each and every month I don't
 2 know what detained him tonight, but he's one of our most regular
 3 attendees. I actually -- this is a perfect place for the RAB to have an input
 4 in their agenda. We may be able to request of MLGW for some kind of
 5 future presentation, and I'll take that up the next time and get that back to
 6 Mr Webb

7 MR. WILLIAMS: Any more comments or -- could I get a motion to adjourn the meeting?
 8 Can I get a second?

9 MS. PETERS: Second

10 MR. WILLIAMS: All in favor? Any opposed? Abstained? Motion is carried The meeting is
 11 adjourned

12 MR. PHILLIPS: Let me mention that we're going to take a short break here. If you need to
 13 use the restroom or go get a soda, we'll start back up in about five to 10
 14 minutes with the presentation for tonight. Thank you
