SUBJECT: Alabama Department of Environmental Management, Memorandum from Jim Grassiano, September 10, 2004, Re: Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM) Field Visit to the Northern Charlie Area: Review of Munitions and Explosives of Concern (MEC) Road Clearance Activities Being Performed by the Army

Dear Mr. Cobb. Steve

As a follow up to our conversation from September 20, 2004, regarding the implication of the Corps of Engineers (COE) Safety Specialist's not reporting several repositioned MEC items. I have had the opportunity to review a number of documents and provide to you the following observations:

- (a) The COE Form 948 (enclosure 1) did not identify the fact that the COE Safety Specialist had observed MEC items in the area adjacent to the road clearance activities. The reason the 948 did not identify these items, is that the 948 is documentation from the COE to the contractor relative to contract performance issues. Since these MEC items were outside the contract performance area it was not appropriate to document in the 948.
- (b) The USACE Ordnance and Explosive Project Daily Quality Assurance Report, dated 21 July 2004 (enclosure 2) documents the fact that the Safety Specialists observed that the No Further Action (NFA) adjacent to the road clearance area was contaminated with MEC. His statement in the General Observations, item 2 states "The area that was determined to be NFA is in fact littered with OF and OE related scrap I don't concur with this being a NFA area". It is clear in this report that the Safety Specialist was aware of the MEC and according to enclosure 3, promptly notified his supervisor and the COF Project Manager (PM) on 21 July 2004.
- tc) Final dated 23 July 2004, 7.03 AM from Dan Copeland, COE PM to Ron Levy tenclosure 4) documents that the COE PM notified Ft MeClellan Transition Force (TF) that the NFA area adjacent to the cleared road segments had a substantial amount of OE Scrap and recommended that TF notify the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. It was at this point that contract actions were initiated to include this NFA as a clearance area.

- (d) Email dated 23 July 2004, 12:00 PM from Art Holcomb TTFW PM to Dan Copeland (enclosure 5) further documents the fact that the COE, TF and Tetra Tech Foster Wheeler (TTFW) were fully aware and engaged in addressing the MEC items identified by enclosure 2.
- (c) The request for OE Contract Action dated 26 July 2004 (enclosure 6) formally initiated the formal contract action to provide for the NFA area to be cleared.
- (f) Email dated 27 July 2004 from TTFW to COE Dan Copeland (enclosure 7) was the draft proposal to respond to the NFA area by the contractor.

There is additional supporting documentation to the actions of the COE and TF, but I feel this is sufficient information to convey to ADEM that the Army was aware that MEC items were in the NFA area and that the Army was responsive to the situation. I would note that within five working days the Army had agreed that an action was prudent for this NFA area, had prepared a Contract Statement of Work, and had a draft proposal from the contractor to execute this work.

Based on these documents provided by enclosure and other supporting documentation, these MEC items, regardless whether they were moved, placed or left there from previous Army actions, were properly identified and actions immediately initiated. I therefore request that the referenced memorandum be corrected to reflect that the Army had initiated prudent and timely actions for this NFA area.

MEMORANDUM FOR Record

SUBJECT: Events leading up to The Administrative Order issued by ADEM in reference to Ft McClellan, ${\rm AL}\,$

On 1 July 04 I observed dig Tm 2 performing intrusive operations on segment 056 approximately from 0800-0930. There were 6 unfuzed and/or expended practice 81mm mortars on the side of the road that the team had unearthed and 1, 81mm mortar being unearthed. The Tm went on break around 0900-0915 after their break the Tm placed these items in a scrap bucket. From 0930-1400 I preformed QA on 2 segments and the required paperwork for an additional 5 segments turned over for QA and the daily QARs. I returned to observe the team again around 1400-1430 the Tm was about 98% complete and at the Far East side of the segment. I ask the team leader Dave Leshko if they found anything good today his response was that they only found expended practice mortars and he wouldn't have a count until the end of the day.

On 20 July 04 Grady Bendel UXOQC/UXOSO turned over a total of 16 segments for Government QA to include segment 056. I ask him how all the segments looked He stated that they all looked very good and reminded me that segment 056 was a boundary segment and the north side of the road was a NFA (no further action) area, this raised great concern considering I observed the dig Tm unearth ordnance from this area, and the Tm dig sheet counted a total of 36, 81mm practice/expended mortars dug within 1-20 feet from the NFA.

On 21 July 04 at or around 0700 I contacted Dan Copeland (Project Manger) and Greg Parsons (acting OE safety chief) and expressed my concerns and nonoccurrence with the NFA area. I preformed about a 60-70% QA of segment 056 because of the amount of ordnance that was found during the Contractors intrusive investigation. At the end of my QA I went into the NFA to look for the presence of OE or OE related scrap. I found 3, 81mm mortars 1 on the surface (later determined to be practice/expended) and 2 nosed in the ground, this was the evidence I needed to discredit this area as a NFA and documented this on my QAR and passed the information on to Dan Copeland. Looking back now on the one mortar that was on the surface I guess it could

have been moved/placed by the contractor but I wasn't looking for moved ordnance nor did I have any reason to look for moved ordnance I was simply looking for OE to discredit the NFA so this area could be added to the clearance area for obvious safety reasons. Looking at what we found in the road and anticipating ADEM concerns I would recommend we look at segments 12, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58 & 32. Although 32 had nothing it is a very short sector that turns out into the NFA area. 11 also had nothing of note but you might was to add it also as a precaution since it is just a continuation of the road that includes 12. There was one 81mm practice in segment 12 several in each of the 53 - 58 segments.
