1. Personnel: Tom Meeks-OESS Huntsville, Daney Gipson-Demo Safety Officer.
2. Project: Task 12 - Rapid Munitions Response Services - McClellan, Alabama
3. Personnel Contacts: Lisa Holstein-TF, Van Roberts-MDA, Terry Hamil-PM Huntsville
4. Field Activities: On Wednesday, May 09, 2018 at 0800 the ZAPATA's SUXOS, Scott Sigler was contacted by MDA Operations, Mr. Van Roberts concerning Small Arms Ammunition (Figure 1) that an MDA crew located while excavating a drainage ditch at the International Automotive Components Building (Figure 2). The event unfolded as follows:

0810: The ZAPATA's SUXOS, Scott Sigler notified Michael Winningham, ZAPATA PM of the situation.

0930: S. Sigler notified Lisa Holstein with the Transition Force of the situation.

0945: S. Sigler tasked the Demolition Safety, D. Gipson, and the OESS Huntsville, T. Meeks, to investigate.

1020: Terry Hamill PM Huntsville was contacted by T. Meeks and D. Gipson for authorization to remove and dispose of the Small Arms Ammunition.

1410: Eighty (80) live Small Arms Rounds were recovered by T. Meeks and D. Gipson. The remaining spent brass was left in place (Figures 3 & 4).

1558: The items were transported by D. Gipson and included in ZAPATA's daily disposal shot.

5. Technical Discussion: Eighty (80) assorted Small Arms Rounds (Figure 5) were disposed of by detonation using the following donor explosives: 5 feet of 50 Grain Detonating Cord.

6. Conclusion/Recommendations: The Area was reported as the former DRMO Yard. Additional items may be found.
