22	MR. GENE HOWARD: Any questions
23	about the minutes?

1	MR. PENN WILSON: I move the
2	minutes be approved.
3	MR. GENE HOWARD: Move to be
4	adopted. Any second?
5	DR. JOHN SPAIN: Second.
6	MR. GENE HOWARD: All in favor say
7	aye. Same signs, no.
8	(No opposition verbalized.)
9	MR. GENE HOWARD: We've got some
10	old business to take care of. We've got to
11	vote for the vice-chair, who happens to be
12	me, at this time, to become the community
13	co-chair.
14	Do we have a recommendation on
15	that?
16	MR. MONTY CLENDENIN: Failed for
17	lack of a second. I move that
18	MR. GENE HOWARD: We know you
19	move. Any second?
20	DR. JOHN SPAIN: I second.
21	MR. GENE HOWARD: All in favor say
22	aye. Same sign opposing.
23	(No opposition verbalized.)

1	MR. GENE HOWARD: Now, we need a
2	new vice-chair. The floor is open for
3	nominations for a new vice-chair. Do we have
4	any nominations?
5	DR. JOHN SPAIN: I would nominate
6	Cheryl Bragg.
7	MR. GENE HOWARD: Ms.
8	Cheryl Bragg. Cheryl is a good gal.
9	Any more nominations?
10	DR. MICHAEL KIMBERLY: Make a
11	motion the nominations be closed.
12	MR. GENE HOWARD: Got a motion
13	that the nominations be closed. Any second?
14	MR. JAMES BUFORD: Second. All in
15	favor say aye. By acclamation.
16	MS. CHERYL BRAGG: Thank you, I
17	think.
18	MR. GENE HOWARD: Actually, Cheryl
19	in this room, Cheryl is the person I've
20	known longer than anybody else. We I
21	guess you were, what, a teenager?
22	MS. CHERYL BRAGG: Uh-huh.
23	MR. GENE HOWARD: Her and my

1	daughter grew up together, and they were very
2	fast friends.
3	So, Cheryl is good stuff. Got a
4	good mamma and a good daddy, good grandmother
5	and good granddaddy.
6	MS. CHERYL BRAGG: Thank you.
7	MR. GENE HOWARD: That's the
8	reason she turned out as well as she did.
9	All right, Ms. Cheryl Bragg, you're the new
10	vice-chair. And you'll add immensely to it.
11	There is not a program today, but
12	we do have some new business to take care of.
13	And immediately to my left is ADEM. And you
14	have that report. Go.
15	MS. BRANDI LITTLE: You should
16	have gotten just gotten our report. The
17	only thing that I can really note this
18	quarter is we didn't get very many documents
19	in, but we seemed to get a whole bunch of
20	them out. The most the two most notable
21	were the Iron Mountain Road remedial
22	investigation and the Bains Gap Road remedial
23	investigation. Those have been holding us up

1	for a very long time, and we're glad that
2	they're done.
3	And if you have any other
4	questions or anything about it, just let me
5	know.
6	MR. GENE HOWARD: Need anything
7	explained? Illustrated? Discussed?
8	Did a good job. Nobody is
9	talking.
10	EPA? Do we have anything on EPA?
11	MS. BRENDA CUNNINGHAM: No. They
12	did not send a report.
13	MR. GENE HOWARD: Didn't send
14	anything?
15	MS. BRENDA CUNNINGHAM: Doyle
16	Brittain has retired, so Bart Reedy is taking
17	his place. But I'm not sure that he'll be
18	attending, either. I have contacted him and
19	sent him the information, but
20	MR. GENE HOWARD: Okay. National
21	Guard is not here, and didn't send a
22	representative, so we won't hear anything
23	from them.

1	MDA?
2	MR. ROGER HALL: We like like
3	Brandi, it seems like we give more or less
4	the same report every quarter. But the
5	milestones that we reached are one of our
6	volatile organic groundwater sites, T-6, we
7	have had a startup of the equipment at the
8	factory, just a trial run, and to sort of
9	prove the equipment out. It's not been
10	delivered nor installed on site, yet.
11	And the other the UXO work
12	continues as noted on the report that I'm
13	hoping everybody got, got a copy of. We
14	think we got it to Brenda early enough to get
15	it in your package.
16	We're continuing on our munitions
17	response site work. And hopefully, at the
18	April meeting, we hope to report that at
19	least two other MRSs are complete, as far as
20	fieldwork for UXO removal.
21	Other than that, we're plugging
22	away at picking up scrap and unexploded

1	MR. GENE HOWARD: Any questions?
2	DR. JOHN SPAIN: I do have a
3	question. I think it's connected. It might
4	be indirectly connected.
5	But I believe that we have
6	recently had a great deal of problems here
7	associated with the deer hunts. And one of
8	the reasons that we had the deer hunts, I
9	assume, at the locations that where they
10	have been held has been because of the
11	unexploded ordnance in other locations.
12	I feel like there's a larger
13	problem, even than the hunts, is the
14	unauthorized hunting that is going on here at
15	McClellan, even in the locations where we are
16	currently clearing.
17	So, what is being done to monitor
18	that? To make sure that it does not happen?
19	And to deal with the offenders when it does
20	happen?
21	MR. ROGER HALL: Well, let me see
22	if I can give a first response to that. But

1	because Michelle has been dealing with the
2	sheriff and the county officials and others
3	that have been helping with that hunt over
4	the past couple of years.
5	I don't believe that my company,
6	Matrix, really has any kind of jurisdiction
7	over the hunters, per se. We try to maintain
8	security in those areas so that people will
9	know when they're walking into a UXO-laden
10	area or and we try to maintain security
11	with gates and locks to prevent driving in
12	those areas.
13	But other than that,
14	Councilman Spain, we just we don't we
15	don't really monitor, and certainly don't
16	enforce hunting.
17	Am I saying that right, Michelle?
18	MS. MICHELLE KLOMP: Yes.
19	We our job is to keep people out of areas
20	that are contaminated with UXO. We've been
21	tasked by the Army with certain land-use

22	control	s fo	or spec	cific	c properties	s, sc	we ha	ave
23	fences	and	signs	and	barricades	and	gates	and

1	staff of security that work seven days a
2	week, patrolling the areas that are under
3	those land-use controls.
4	The rest of McClellan, if it's not
5	covered by one of those land-use controls
6	that we are responsible for, the rest of
7	McClellan is covered by the MDA. And they
8	also have, I believe, it's a twenty-four
9	hour, but it might just be seven days a week,
10	security patrols.
11	DR. JOHN SPAIN: Well, certainly,
12	I see enough liability to go around here.
13	You know, especially, as I understand it,
14	Matrix did in fact designate the area for
15	this past hunt.
16	MR. ROGER HALL: Correct.
17	MS. MICHELLE KLOMP: No, it's not
18	correct.
19	MR. ROGER HALL: Okay, not
20	correct.
21	DR. JOHN SPAIN: Well, that's

1 were -- I think we were in the discussions about those areas, but I'm not sure we had 2 3 the final say on the --DR. JOHN SPAIN: Well, the hunt 5 ended up -- the hunt line and the property line of residents here at McClellan ended up 6 7 being one in the same, which certainly, 8 potentially -- this is an extreme, but potentially, I could be on my deck over here 9 10 and get shot by an arrow. So, you know, that 11 was -- whoever made those decisions, it was 12 certainly not a good decision. 13 But in the event that somebody ends up here hunting from an unauthorized 14 15 standpoint, out in the areas where unexploded 16 ordnance is being dealt with, you know, there 17 are certainly going to be liability questions 18 there. You know, was that properly

protected? Was it properly secured? How did

people get out there to hunt? You know, how

19

21	did they get blown up? You know, what
22	So, I don't think somebody can
23	just declare that there is no liability here

1 when in fact there is going to be many 2 questions about how good was the security, all of those kind of things will be asked, 3 should we have an incident like that. 4 5 And I certainly know that we have had several incidences of unauthorized 7 hunting that is going on, in those areas. So --8 9 MS. MICHELLE KLOMP: Well, if you 10 have specific instances, we would love to hear about that. Our security patrols are 11 12 doing the best that they can. And they report to us when they find breaches in 13 security. But if you know of ones that we 14 15 don't know of, we would certainly love to 16 have that information. DR. JOHN SPAIN: Well --17 18 MS. MICHELLE KLOMP: As far as choosing the hunt areas, we take that 19 20 direction from the McClellan Development

21	Authority. They requested us to put together
22	the maps for them because our GIS department
23	did a lot of their mapping (phonetic). But

1	that was the extent of our interest.
2	In choosing the hunt locations, we
3	just advised them on areas where we are not
4	allowed to have public access.
5	DR. JOHN SPAIN: Okay. I don't
6	mean to prolong this in this particular
7	forum, but I think we're going around in a
8	circle here, because I you know, I've
9	talked with McClellan, and it seems like
10	everybody is kind of pushing it to the next
11	party, along the line.
12	But from an unexploded ordnance
13	perspective and the security in those
14	locations, I believe it comes under the
15	purview of this this group here, you know,
16	how well are we protected in securing those
17	locations.
18	So, you know, I would certainly ask

that we hear a more extensive report on the

20	security of those locations at our next
21	meeting in this forum here.
22	MR. ROGER HALL: Well, we'll see
23	if we can assist in that, but, John,

1	we're we're the hunt is not something
2	that's particularly popular with certain
3	people in this room.
4	DR. JOHN SPAIN: Well, it's
5	certainly not
6	MR. ROGER HALL: Us being
7	included.
8	DR. JOHN SPAIN: It's certainly
9	not popular with me
10	MR. ROGER HALL: That's the
11	challenge
12	DR. JOHN SPAIN: but that's not
13	what I'm asking. I am asking how are we
14	protecting those areas where we are working
15	and we're not allowing anybody on period?
16	MS. MICHELLE KLOMP: Are you
17	asking about property that is the purview
18	of the RAB, so that would be the Charlie area
19	and the sites that the Army oversees the

20	cleanup	of?	Or	are	you	asking	about	the	9
21	MDA's p	ropeı	rty?

1	MS. MICHELLE KLOMP: Okay.
2	DR. JOHN SPAIN: Only property
3	that is currently being cleaned up.
4	MS. MICHELLE KLOMP: Well, the
5	property that Matrix is cleaning up that
6	we're involved in the security in is MDA
7	property. So, we're not involved in property
8	that actually falls under the purview of the
9	RAB.
10	If you want to know how the RAB is
11	protecting how the RAB sites are being
12	protected, you'd have to talk to the
13	transition force's security.
14	DR. JOHN SPAIN: So okay, so,
15	you're okay. Then I probably got this
16	wrong. I apologize.
17	Then you are only dealing with the
18	MDA's property?

9	question. Matrix has been doing some
10	cleanup, I note, on the property that adjoins
11	LaGarde Park, and I just wondered and it
12	may be in this report but is that
13	complete? Or is that still in progress? Do
14	you know, off the top of your head?
15	MR. ROGER HALL: If you will tell
16	me where LaGarde Park is, I can answer that.
17	I think it's over near what we call MRS-6.
18	Is

19		MS. MICHELLE KLOMP: You got it,
20	Roger.	
21		MS. CHERYL BRAGG: Is that it?
22	Okay.	
23		MS. MICHELLE KLOMP: That's it.

1	MR. ROGER HALL: We are so close
2	to being finished there, that we've not
3	been able to get into that work site now for
4	days. It's very hilly and mountainous back
5	in there. And our vehicles, our work
6	vehicles, just flat can't get there because
7	of the steepness and the they're basically
8	just (demonstrating) just dirt roads.
9	Not even roads, they're just dirt paths,
10	really, to the work site.
11	Mid to late February, we should be
12	completely out of those that tract, with
13	no further well, we have some paperwork
14	activities to to submit to these guys.
15	But our fieldwork will be complete, if we can
16	just get a break from the rain. All last
17	week nobody could get in. Then it rained all

18	day. Got two inches of rain yesterday.
19	We're now not there today because they can't
20	get in.
21	But we're really down as we
22	used to say in the cotton fields, we're in
23	the short rows now Very little work to be

1	done in the field.
2	MS. CHERYL BRAGG: We appreciate
3	your company has worked very closely with
4	us to let us know what was going on and
5	consulted us when the road had to be closed,
6	so thank you for that.
7	MR. GENE HOWARD: Anybody have any
8	more questions for MDA?
9	Army, Lisa Holstein.
10	MS. LISA HOLSTEIN: Right here.
11	MR. GENE HOWARD: Go ahead.
12	MS. LISA HOLSTEIN: Under the
13	military munitions program, we're doing the
14	Charlie area EE/CA and a removal action at
15	four ranges. As far as the Charlie area
16	EE/CA is concerned, we're preparing a work
17	plan for additional sampling. And we should

18	be sending that to ADEM by the end of this
19	week or early next week. And the fieldwork
20	is expected to begin early spring for that
21	additional sampling.
22	On the Charlie area removal
23	action, the fieldwork is underway and

2	2010, also.
3	There were no changes since the
4	last meeting under the installation
5	restoration program.
6	Under property transfers, the
7	water tank sites that's no changes to
8	that. Property transfer is pending official
9	designation of property recipient.
10	Under the Iron Mountain Road
11	addition
12	MR. PHILLIP BURGETT: I'm sorry.
13	What does that mean?
14	MS. LISA HOLSTEIN: What does what
15	mean?
16	MR. PHILLIP BURGETT: The last
