Dear Mr. Bolton:

The Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM or the Department) has reviewed Fort McClellan's *Final, Revision 1 – SI and DD for Former Tank Ranges, Former Grenade Range and Impact Areas*. The Department issued a concurrence letter for the Final SI for no further action (NFA) on November 21, 2007. However, the Department had concerns with the Army's usage of a site-wide hazard index (HI) of 1.49 instead of 1.0 as per Alabama Risk-Based Corrective Action guidance and the statement made throughout the text that the decision for NFA was made during a Base Realignment and Closure Cleanup Team (BCT) meeting in May 2007, which was contrary to the meeting minutes. The Department reiterated these concerns in a May 2, 2008 comment letter for the Final DD, in which ADEM requested that the Army submit slip pages to revise both documents. The Department received the subject slip pages on March 23, 2012 and concurs that all comments are resolved and both documents are complete.

The Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM or the Department) has reviewed Fort McClellan's *Final Decision Document for Former Tank Ranges, Former Grenade Range and Impact Areas*. The subject document recommends no further action (NFA) and unrestricted land reuse with regard to Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA)-related hazardous substances and states that ADEM concurred with this recommendation in a November 21, 2007 letter. The Department issued a Review and Concurrence letter for the Final Site Investigation (SI) on November 21, 2007 stating that it concurs with the Army's recommendation for unrestricted NFA because the site was evaluated using residential clean-up standards, but also stated concerns regarding the SI report. The first concern is the Army's usage of a site-wide hazard index (HI) of 1.49 instead of 1.0 as per Alabama Risk-Based Corrective Action guidance. The second concern is the statement made in the text that the decision for NFA was made during a Base Realignment and Closure Cleanup Team (BCT) meeting in May 2007. The November 21, 2007 letter reiterated that the Department does not provide concurrence for NFA at BCT meetings and all references to the contrary be removed in the revised SI document. No revisions to the SI were submitted to ADEM and the Final Decision Document (DD) contains the same statement as the SI that "in May 2007, the BCT made a risk management decision that the detected levels of contaminants at this site do not warrant further investigation or remedial action." The Department requests that Fort McClellan submit slip pages to revise both the SI and DD documents.

The Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM or the Department) has reviewed Fort McClellan's *Final Site Investigation Report* for the Former Tank Ranges.

ADEM notes that the future reuse of the site includes the northeast portion of the site as part of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's (USFWS) Wildlife Refuge, and the remainder of the site is planned for passive recreation reuse. The Department also notes that the Army is recommending "No Further Action" (NFA) and unrestricted land reuse. Because the site was evaluated using residential clean-up standards, ADEM concurs with the Army's recommendation for unrestricted NFA with regard to Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA)-regulated hazardous substances for the Former Tank Ranges.

Please note that ADEM still has concerns regarding this SI report. As mentioned in ADEM's Specific Comment 21, Alabama Risk-Based Corrective Action (ARBCA) Guidance requires that the site-wide hazard index (HI) should not exceed 1.0; therefore a value of 1.49 should not be used to calculate any site risks. Also, during a meeting held on October 11 and 12, 2007 with ADEM, the Army, and their respective contractors to discuss the Remedial Investigation (RI) reports for Iron Mountain Road, Bains Gap Road, and Baby Bains Gap Road, it was agreed that all future investigation reports would not use a value that exceeded an HI of 1.0. Please address this issue in the revised document.

Also, please note that a letter, attached for your reference, was sent to the Fort McClellan BRAC (Base Realignment and Closure) Environmental Coordinator and U.S. Army

Corps of Engineers on November 12, 2004 stating that final Departmental concurrence is not provided for an NFA during BRAC Cleanup Team (BCT) meetings. ADEM would like to reiterate at this time that final Departmental concurrence is not provided for an NFA during BCT meetings. Text on Pages ES-2 and 6-2 of the subject document states that, "In May 2007, the BCT made a risk management decision that the detected levels of contaminants at this site do not warrant further investigation or remedial action." It is also specifically stated that "the project team agreed that NFA is appropriate for this site during the May 2007 BCT Meeting" in the Army's responses to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) General Comment 1, the USFWS's Comments 5, 7, and 8, and in the reply to ADEM's evaluation of the response to General Comment 1. The Department would also like to note that the above referenced responses clearly contradict the BCT meeting minutes dated May 6, 2007, also attached for your reference, which state on page 6 that "EPA and USFWS indicated their agreement that NFA is appropriate for this site based on the additional data. ADEM will respond to the Army regarding their decision for this site." All applicable text in the subject document should be revised to remove any reference that a decision for NFA was agreed to by the project team during a BCT meeting. This would apply to all future correspondence and documents as well.

Dear Mr. Levy and Mr. Coker:

The Alabama Department of Environmental Management (ADEM or the Department) received the Army's letter addressing ADEM's review comments on the Draft RI Work Plan for Choccolocco Corridor Ranges. The Department's comments were presented in a letter to the Army dated June 18, 2004. In the subject response letter, the Army states that ADEM's comments were issued after fieldwork was completed. Therefore, ADEM understands that the Army intends to address the Department's comments in a "Variance" section of the Draft RI report.

The Department once again finds it necessary to clarify the limitations of the BCT's actions. The Army stated in its letter that *the proposed RI field activities were discussed and approved by the BCT at the April 2003 project team meeting*. According to the minutes of the April 23, 2004 BCT meeting, *the BCT concurred with the RI approach Shaw proposed, including the XRF survey, soil borings, surface soil, groundwater, and surface water/sediment sampling program*. Fort McClellan should understand that the BCT does not approve formal workplans for implementation purposes. Likewise, ADEM representatives on the BCT do not provide Department approval of workplans or reports. Thus, it is inappropriate to imply ADEM's concurrence on proposed work based on general meeting discussions.

Check-In – Participants introduced themselves and are listed on Attachment A.

Finalize Agenda and Minutes – The team approved the February 2007 meeting minutes without changes.

Action Items – The team reviewed the action items. The updated list is provided herein.

Document Status Tracking – Lisa provided the team with the latest version of the document status tracking spreadsheet. Bold entries are priority.

**Former Tank Ranges Supplemental Data Review**

Shaw provided a handout and summary of the supplemental soil sampling data. The data indicate that the previous elevated cadmium detection was spurious and that the supplemental data are consistent with but lower than the SI data. EPA and USFWS indicated their agreement that NFA is appropriate for this site based on the additional data. ADEM will respond to the Army regarding their decision for this site.

**Revised Lines of Evidence Table**

Shaw distributed the revised Lines of Evidence table to be included in RI reports. The table was revised based on input from the BCT during the February 2007 meeting. The team agreed with the revised table without any changes; however, it was suggested that specifics (e.g., frequency of detection, concentrations) be added wherever possible.

**Particle Ingestion**

EPA presented a status update of work being done by its Office of Research and Development. Intent of presentation was to decide whether or how to include info currently being developed by ERASC in FTMC risk assessments. A copy of the presentation is

included as Attachment F.

### **Statistics**

EPA provided an overview of work done by Evan Englund. A copy of the presentation is included as Attachment G.
