MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: US Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Pre-2015 Regulatory Regime Approved Jurisdictional Determination in Light of *Sackett v. EPA*, 598 U.S. 651 (2023), SAM-2024-00863-MDJ MFR #1 of 1²

BACKGROUND. An Approved Jurisdictional Determination (AJD) is a Corps document stating the presence or absence of waters of the United States on a parcel or a written statement and map identifying the limits of waters of the United States on a parcel. AJDs are clearly designated appealable actions and will include a basis of JD with the document.³ AJDs are case-specific and are typically made in response to a request. AJDs are valid for a period of five years unless new information warrants revision of the determination before the expiration date or a District Engineer has identified, after public notice and comment, that specific geographic areas with rapidly changing environmental conditions merit re-verification on a more frequent basis.⁴ For the purposes of this AJD, we have relied on section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 (RHA),⁵ the Clean Water Act (CWA) implementing regulations published by the Department of the Army in 1986 and amended in 1993 (references 2.a. and 2.b. respectively), the 2008 Rapanos-Carabell guidance (reference 2.c.), and other applicable guidance, relevant case law and longstanding practice, (collectively the pre-2015 regulatory regime), and the Sackett decision (reference 2.d.) in evaluating iurisdiction.

This Memorandum for Record (MFR) constitutes the basis of jurisdiction for a Corps AJD as defined in 33 CFR §331.2. The features addressed in this AJD were evaluated consistent with the definition of "waters of the United States" found in the pre-2015 regulatory regime and consistent with the Supreme Court's decision in *Sackett*. This AJD did not rely on the 2023 "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States," as

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amended on 8 September 2023 (Amended 2023 Rule) because, as of the date of this decision, the Amended 2023 Rule is not applicable the state of Alabama due to litigation.

1. SUMMARY OF CONCLUSIONS.

 - i. <u>Isolated WL (IWL)</u>: Non-WOTUS, non-jurisdictional depressional wetland approximately 4.93acres (214,857-square feet) in area, which lacks a continuous surface connection to a jurisdictional water.

- 3. REVIEW AREA. The review area consists of approximately 78.1 acres with an approximate center point located at Latitude: 30.677401 North, Longitude 87.775740 West; within Section 21, of Township 4 South, Range 3 East; in Loxley, Baldwin County Alabama. The review area is bounded by active silviculture land and transected by a maintained silviculture access road. The review area is a subsection of a larger parcel identified by the Baldwin County Parcel Number: 05-33-05-21-0-000-001.000 (PIN: 72255).
- 4. NEAREST TRADITIONAL NAVIGABLE WATER (TNW), INTERSTATE WATER, OR THE TERRITORIAL SEAS TO WHICH THE AQUATIC RESOURCE IS CONNECTED. The nearest TNW, interstate water, or territorial sea is Fish River which is approximately 16.4 miles to the south and west of the review area which becomes a Section 10 Water at approximately river mile 8. Fish River is on the

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Mobile District's Section 10 Waters List. Section 10 waters are a subset of TNWs. See attached mapping⁶

5. FLOWPATH FROM THE SUBJECT AQUATIC RESOURCES TO A TNW, INTERSTATE WATER, OR THE TERRITORIAL SEAS

Isolated WL (IWL): As evidenced in the attached photolog, IWL is a depressional non-tidal palustrine forested wetland which is completely surrounded by uplands. IWL lacks both inflow and outflow, and therefore does not have a flow path to a TNW, interstate water, or territorial sea.


Isolated WL (IWL): IWL is an approximately 4.93-acre (214,857-square-feet) non-tidal palustrine depressional wetland that is surrounded, in its entirety, by uplands. There is no channel flowing into or out of IWL. For these reasons, IWL lacks a continuous surface connection to a RPW, TNW, territorial seas, interstate water, or impoundment of a jurisdictional water; therefore, IWL is not jurisdictional.

 - a. On January 2, 2024, a site visit was conducted as evidenced in the photolog included in the administrative record. A second site visit was conducted on January 6, 2024. See attached Photo Log.
 - Applicant provided wetland delineation which includes both mapping and wetland determination data forms from the Atlantic and Gulf Coastal Plain Region Regional Supplement, and dated July 16, 2024, and October 14, 2024.
 - c. Office evaluations were conducted periodically from February 2024 to October 2024 via inspection of mapping layer accessible through the National Regulatory Viewer (NRV) which includes, but is not limited to, U.S. Geological Survey topographical mapping, the National Hydrological Dataset, 3DEP Elevation Modeling, 3DEP Hillshade Modeling, Nation Oceanographic and Atmospheric (NOAA) LiDAR data, Google Earth Pro historic aerial imagery, National Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) soil mapping, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Nation Wetland Inventory (NWI) Mapping.




