PROPOSED WETLAND FILL FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A RESIDENTIAL SUBDIVISION, ST. MARTIN, JACKSON COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

This District has received an application for a Department of the Army (DA) permit pursuant to Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 USC 1344). Please communicate this information to interested parties.

WATERWAY AND LOCATION: Wetlands associated with Bayou Talla, Section 8, Township 7 S, Range 8 W, Community of St. Martin, Jackson County, Mississippi. (Latitude: 30.4519° North; Longitude: -88.8101° West). The area is depicted on the Mississippi-Ocean Springs Quadrangle, United States Geological Survey Topographic Map, Hydrologic Unit Code 03170009.

PROPOSED WORK: The applicant proposes to fill 25.40 acres of wetlands associated with the construction of a 103-lot residential subdivision on land located to the north and south of Walker Road in St. Martin, Jackson County, Mississippi. The total project site is approximately 37.14 acres in size of which 31.82 acres have been identified as wetlands. The applicant proposes to provide in-kind compensatory mitigation through a mitigation bank.

The applicant has applied for coastal zone (CZ) consistency in accordance with the State Coastal Zone Management Program. A determination relative to CZ consistency will be made by the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources.

The Clean Water Act (CWA) Section 401 Certification Rule (Certification Rule, 40 CFR 121), requires certification for any license or permit that authorizes an activity that may result in a discharge. The applicant is responsible for requesting certification and providing required information to the certifying agency.

This public notice is being distributed to all known interested persons in order to assist in developing facts on which a decision by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers can be based. For accuracy and completeness of the record, all data in support of or in opposition to the proposed work should be submitted in writing setting forth sufficient detail to furnish a clear understanding of the reasons for support or opposition.

The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impact including cumulative impacts of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefit which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, historic properties, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, floodplain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs, consideration of property ownership and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people.

The Corps of Engineers is soliciting comments from the public; Federal, State, and local agencies and officials; Indian Tribes; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this proposed activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps of Engineers to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for this proposal. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the proposed activity.

Any person may request, in writing, within the comment period specified in this notice, that a public hearing be held to consider this application. Requests for public hearings shall state with particularity, the reasons for holding a public hearing.

Evaluation of the probable impacts involving deposits of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States will include the application of guidelines established by the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

In accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, and Appendix C of 33 CFR 325, the undertaking defined in this notice is being considered for the potential to affect historic properties. In accordance with Appendix C of 33 CFR 325, the Corps has determined the permit area consists of the entire 37.14-acre parcel. The National Register

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of Historic Places has been consulted and no properties listed in or eligible for the National Register are known to exist which would be affected by the proposed work. A Phase I Cultural Resources Survey was conducted for the roadway in March 2016. The remainder of the subject parcels are wetlands and unlikely to contain cultural resources. Based on the Phase I Cultural Resources Survey and the remainder of the parcels being wetlands, the Corps has determined that the proposed project would have <u>no effect</u> on cultural resources in the permit area. However, we are seeking comment from the State Historic Preservation Officer, federally recognized American Indian tribes, local historical societies, museums, universities, the National Park Service, and the general public regarding the existence or the potential for existence of significant cultural and historic properties which may be affected by the work. This action constitutes the full extent of cultural resources investigations unless comment to this notice is received documenting that significant sites or properties exist which may be affected by this work, or that adequately documents that a potential exists for the location of significant sites or properties within the project area.

A preliminary review of this application, the U.S. Department of the Interior List of Endangered and Threatened Wildlife and Plants and the National Marine Fisheries Service list of Mississippi's Threatened and Endangered Species indicate the proposed activity will have no effect on the Mississippi Sandhill Crane (*Grus canadensis pulla*)(E), the Dusky Gopher Frog (*Rana sevosa*)(E), the Black Pinesnake (*Pituophis melanoleucus lodingi*)(T), the Louisiana Quillwort (*Isoetes louisianensis*)(E), the Eastern Black Rail (*Laterallus jamaicensis*)(T), the Wood Stork (*Mycteria americana*)(T), the Gopher Tortoise (*Gopherus polyphemus*)(T), and the Alabama Red-Bellied Turtle (*Pseudemys alabamensis*)(E) or their critical habitat. This notice serves as request to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and National Marine Fisheries Service for information on whether any listed or proposed to be listed endangered or threatened species may be present in the area which would be affected by the proposed activity.

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





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


FIGURE 3. CROSS SECTION MAP FOR WALKER ROAD SUBDIVISION PROPOSED PROJECT
